Lunch: We will enjoy lunch at Camden Valley Inn, 290 Remembrance Drive, Cawdor on the way home.


Cost: The airport is free but lunch is at your own cost.

This guided tour is entitled 'Up and Atom' featuring a science tour of one of Australia's largest public research organisations. With over 350 scientists and researchers, The Australian Nuclear Science and Technology Organisation (ANSTO) is home to

some of Australia's most critical scientific infrastructure including the nation's only research reactor, a suite of neutron beam instruments, particular accelerators, cyclotrons and the Australian Synchrotron.

This amazing tour is customised for retiree groups with <u>non-technical</u> explanations and minimal walking.
