His topic is "The Empire Air Training Scheme" (EATS) which was implemented to train and supply pilots for the RAF WWII European Theatre initially and later pilots for the Pacific War. Amazingly, Australia trained 28,000 air crew during that time! I look forward to hearing Lloyd speak on this subject.

Our guest speaker will be Dr John Conolly and his topic is "What do we know of Climate Change from Deep Ocean Cores?". John's work has spanned the globe and includes affiliations with such entities as the U.S. Naval Oceanographic Office, Scripps Institution of Oceanography, Lamont Doherty Geological Observatory at Columbia University, and numerous major partners in the energy industry and government agencies throughout Australia, New Zealand, South Pacific islands, and the United States. He also founded Rawson Resources Ltd.; an active oil explorer listed on the Australian Stock Exchange in 2005.
