A highlight of 2024 will be our visit to the Australian Museum in Sydney to the "Ramses and the Gold of the Pharaohs" exhibition. This actually starts in November but is heavily booked (many days are booked out) so we have planned our visit for Tuesday, 20<sup>th</sup> February to avoid some of the crowds and also school holidays.

The exhibition features an all-new multisensory museum experience provideing visitors with a window into the life and accomplishments of Ramses II, more commonly known as Ramses the Great, who ruled Egypt for 67 years – the second longest reign for any pharaoh, living an astonishing 92 years. You will see a stunningly preserved collection of artefacts, including sarcophagi, animal mummies, magnificent jewellery, spectacular royal masks, exquisite amulets, and ornate golden treasures of the tomb, showcasing the superb workmanship of Egyptian artisans.

Date: Tuesday, 20th February, 2024

Travel: We will travel by one of the morning trains to arrive at Museum Station around 10:30 and then walk a short distance across Hyde Park to the Museum where the tour begins at 11:30. Return travel will also be by train, but full time will be published closer to the date.
