JANUARY SPEAKERS

Our club speaker is Don Barker. Don has recently joined the club and was a local architect in his working life. He has planned an enormous range of buildings from houses to churches and will relate some of his experiences in that time.

You may have guessed we bee talking about bees this month. Louie Kelbert, a beekeeper for over 40 years will not only talk to the members about his experiences but is also bringing along a small hive for the members to observe and a variety of his products.

FAST FACTS

- The practice of beekeeping dates back at least 4,500 years
- Beekeeping is said to be the second oldest professions. What is the oldest?
- Approximately one third of the food we eat is the result of honeybee pollination
- In their 6 to 8 week lifespan, a worker bee will fly the equivalent distance of $1\frac{1}{2}$ times the circumference of the Earth week.
- A single bee will produce only about 1/12 of a teaspoon of honey in its lifetime.
- Honey was found in King Tut's tomb, and, because it never spoils, it was still good!
- A female worker bee weighs about one tenth of a gram.

ANNUAL MEMBERSHIP FEE

You will remember that last year we introduced a pre-paid morning tea option. This year we are asking members to pay a membership fee totalling \$70. This consists of the basic fee of \$40 (which has not changed for many years) plus the \$30 annual morning tea fee which we have at general meetings. This covers you for the whole year.

The fee for Non-Active members remains at \$40. As they do not attend meetings the \$30 morning tea fee is waived.

It should be noted that as from April this year collection of payments for morning tea paid at the Welcome Table on the day will cease.

The capitation fee paid to Probus South Pacific has been increased but the committee decided to absorb this cost and keep the basic membership fee the same. These fees are due now and may be paid up until 31st March.
