Cancellations up until Thursday, 15th July.

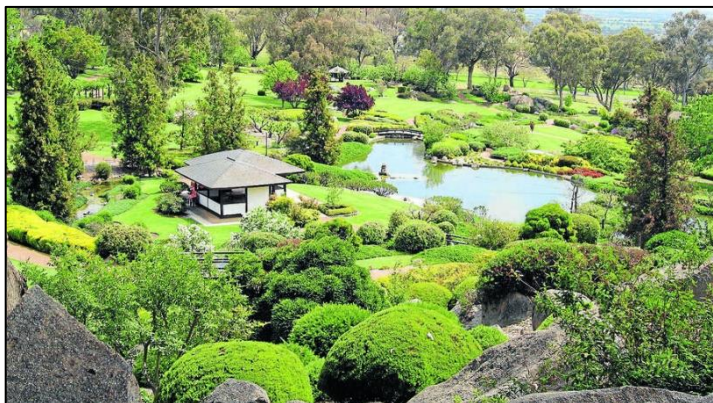

COWRA BREAK

Thanks to our tour director, Gordon Dummer and his assistant, Jennifer Collath we can now announce that there will be a three day/two night trip to Cowra on 16th - 18th September for all members and their wives.

The trip will depart around 8:30 on Thursday, 16th September, travelling to Murrumburrah for lunch and a visit to the sculptor of the Light Horse

Memorial to see “Bill the Bastard” (the horse that saved soldiers in WW1). Then on to Cowra for our traditional “Happy Hour” followed by dinner. Accommodation will be at the RSL Club Motel in the centre of Cowra.



On Friday we leave Cowra and drive to Grenfell to view the Silo Art then on to Forbes and a tour of the McFeeters Motor Museum in Forbes and lunch at the museum café. After lunch a short drive to Eugowra to appreciate their exhibition of street art before proceeding to Canowindra and the Age of Fishes Museum. We return to Cowra for a special dinner on Friday night is at The Quarry Restaurant.

Saturday is free time to choose an activity or two of your own. Perhaps you might choose to visit the Japanese Gardens, which should be lovely in spring, talented artist Ann Morton’s Gallery, the local art gallery, the Lachlan Valley railway Museum or just wander the business district for a bit of shopping before heading off towards home.

WESTERN SYDNEY AIRPORT VISIT

The trip to the new Western Sydney Airport construction site was well attended and interesting. Jim McGrath reported that, “The airport experience was quite short with a guide doing an overall picture of what's taking place today and what it will be like in 2026 when it is expected to be open for business and in 2050 when the second runway will be open!

The total area of the airport is 1770 hectares and is owned by the Federal Government. Lots of heavy equipment was at work such as bulldozers, scrapers,



loaders etc. You name it and its there! Earthworks are due to be completed by the end 2022.



After lunch at the Penrith Panthers Club some of our group left for home while the rest of us went on to the Museum of Fire which showed the history of early fire appliances to post WW2 firefighting equipment.”
