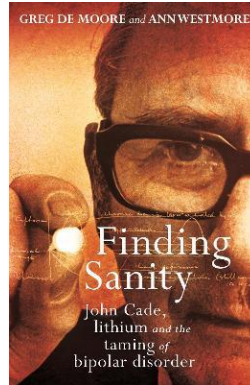
It has been noticeable that meeting attendance over the last few months has been down a bit. Maybe the warmer weather and this month's speakers will bring back the members who haven't been for a while!

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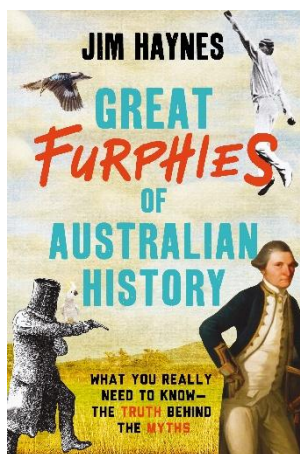
CELEBRATING 50 YEARS EVENT
