No doubt many of you have heard of Arthur Stace, the man they dubbed "Mr Eternity" for the single word which brought him to fame as he scrawled it on pavements throughout Sydney and who will ever forget the word "Eternity" on the Sydney Harbour Bridge during the millennium celebrations.

"Mr Eternity" is a short but interesting read and covers Arthur's life story from his childhood, through his service during World War I, his descent

into life as a petty criminal, alcoholic and impoverished life and the subsequent rehabilitation and work with others who have descended into this lifestyle.

The book by Roy Williams and Elizabeth Meyers paints a graphic picture of the difficulties that caused his downfall and one can only admire the man for his single-mindedness in his mission to help as many people in similar circumstances as possible.
